## 2022 EMPOWER HER NETWORK FINANCIAL INSIGHTS





#### **Operating Expenses**

Once again, the NoVo Foundation underwrote all operating expenses, enabling 100% of additional donor dollars to go to programming. Thank you!

#### **Sustainability Model**

EHN will never be another unmet promise to the survivors we collaborate with. We secure funding for the full value of the 12-18 month Empowerment Plan before committing services. "Earmarked Expenses" represent funds tied to active Empowerment Plans to be spent in 2022.
